

Munoz foundation holds annual youth leadership conference

CINCINNATI —A retired Cincinnati Bengal held a conference to praise Tri-State students Wednesday.

The Anthony Munoz Foundation held its annual youth leadership conference.

The event, much like a concert at times, drew more than 1,500 students from schools across the Tri-State.

“(We) had some motivational leadership speakers and had some breakout sessions. Basically, our theme was ‘plugged in’ and not only talking about being plugged in with their technology but getting plugged in with their technology and the community,” Munoz said.

The foundation’s mission is to engage Tri-State youth mentally, physically and spiritually.

“We learned that the four fundamental steps (are), believe and forgive, and serve and leave a legacy. We learned a lot about ourselves, like that we are the future and that we should take pride in the younger generation,” Quiana Little, of Westwood, said.

“With that message I’m going to take it out and put it into everyday life and I’m going to develop and leave a better legacy than what I have right now,” Woodward student Maurice Reed said.
