## THE WEB extreme entertainment opens March 26 in Liberty Township

When Jerry Weber opened Laser Tag in Fairfield 11 years ago, he was the only operator in the region. Since then five other laser web operations have opened.

He'll reclaim his uniqueness March 26 when he opens THE WEB extreme entertainment in Liberty Township. His new complex in the former Kroger building in Liberty Towne Centre, 7172 Cincinnati-Dayton Road, is five times the size of the Fairfield operation, which closed March 14.

"When I opened up laser web in Fairfield it was the only laser place in town," Weber said. "Since then five others have opened. Now I'm not unique and Cincinnati has become the laser tag capitol of the world. No one – not even New York or Chicago – have as many laser web operations as we do."

While Weber's new entertainment complex has a multi-level laser tag arena featuring Darklight V5 equipment and technology, it also has four other venues that should draw a broader age group, offering something for young children through adults.

Weber said his 55,000 square-foot complex will boast another tri-state first: an inside go-kart track. He's put in more than 500 feet of track with twists and turns to accommodate single and double go-karts.

There is also a Jurassic Par Golf course that features black light, glow-in-the-dark golf with obstacles and challenges. A Hang Ten Mini Bowling alley features balls that are smaller and weigh less than the standard ball. Patrons don't have to rent special shoes either to bowl in the alleys.

A large arcade and redemption center complete the entertainment portion of the complex that can accommodate more than 600 patrons at a time.

The Sweet Spot ice cream shop and Noble Roman's Restaurant round out the complex.

"This is truly a family entertainment complex with something for everyone on the age spectrum – from a five-year-old all the way up to his grandpa," Weber said. "I'm really excited about opening here."

As part of his grand opening March 26, Weber will charge a \$25 fee which will allow patrons access to all the offerings from 6-11 p.m. The full fee will be donated to the Anthony Munoz Foundation.
