The Anthony Muñoz Scholarship Fund has awarded a \$20,000 college scholarship to Denise Hamby of Withrow University High School.

Hamby graduated in the top five of her class. She was a member of the National Honors Society and a two-year member of College for Every Student. She was able to succeed academically while also working at Taco Bell and Pizza Hut for four years to support herself and her family.

She will continue her education at Wright State University where she will major in social work.

Hamby was awarded the scholarship in conjunction with the Hall of Fame Experience presented by PNC Bank. Kiara Freeman of Western Hills University High School, Elizabeth Potter of Sycamore High School, Andrea Session of Princeton High School and Erik Zamudio of Milford High School also received scholarships.

To receive a scholarship from the Anthony Muñoz Scholarship Fund, students must meet several eligibility requirements. They must be an area resident, be attending a local non-proprietary college, university or technical college, be a graduating high school senior with at least a 2.0 GPA, complete and submit required materials to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation and maintain a post-secondary GPA of at least 2.0.

The Anthony Muñoz Scholarship Fund was created by Anthony Muñoz and his family in 2003 to support local youth in achieving their dreams of attending a local college or university. The recipients of the scholarship were chosen by the Muñoz family, in cooperation with Anthony Muñoz Foundation Scholarship Committee and Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation.
